







Cigarette Butt Litter Reduction Checklist Outdoor Events & Festivals

As our society has become more waste and energy conscious, Businesses, Government and Organizations have made significant improvements in recycling practices, waste reduction and energy efficiency to minimize their impact on the environment.

However, until recently, cigarette butt litter, the world's largest environmental litter problem, has not received the same degree of attention. Cigarette butt litter on our streets, in gutters, outside buildings, and scattered by the billions across our cities and countryside has increased considerably since the introduction of indoor & vehicular smoking bans, and this litter rapidly enters our storm-water and aquatic systems - poisoning our environment, degrading its beauty and taking years to break down.

Cigarette butt litter at outdoor events and festivals is primarily created by patrons, and to a lesser extent by industry staff and employees. They're the only ones who can actually reduce the problem of cigarette butt litter, but they need help to do it.

Butt Litter Responsibility provides the means for responsible business owners and Management to assess their efforts to provide adequate education and disposal infrastructure in order to reduce the cigarette butt litter emanating from their business activities.

Are you Butt Litter Responsible?

Below is a checklist to assist you to determine if you are cigarette butt litter responsible.
