As our society has become more waste and energy conscious, Businesses, Councils and Organizations have made significant improvements in recycling practices, waste reduction and energy efficiency to minimize their impact on the environment.

However, until recently, cigare the butt litter, the world's largest environmental litter problem, has not received the same degree of attention. Cigarette butt litter outside buildings, and scattered by the billions across our cities and countryside has increased considerably since the introduction of indoor & vehicular smoking bans, and this litter rapidly enters our stormwater and aquatic systems - poisoning our environment, degrading its beauty and taking years to break down.

Cigarette butt litter at yacht clubs and marinas is primarily created by members and patrons and to a lesser extent by industry staff & contractors. They're the only ones who can actually reduce the problem of butt litter, but they need help to do it. Appropriate butt disposal is even more crucial when that cigarette butt litter goes directly into our waterways because the toxins from these butts can stay lethal to fish, marine mammals & birds for over ten years.

Butt litter compliance provides the means for responsible business owners and Management to assess their efforts to provide adequate education and disposal infrastructure in order to reduce the cigarette butt litter pollution emanating from their organisation's activities, whist simultaneously promoting the highest standards of environmentally responsible trading.
